### A Message from Editor-in-chief Ladette Randolph

This time last year, we were within reach of fully endowing our payments to writers, and this year, we are pleased to announce that we have met our goal. Thanks to your incredible support, we have raised \$1.53 million for The Ploughshares Anniversary Fund, surpassing our initial \$1.5 million target. We couldn't have achieved this without every one of you, and we are deeply grateful for your generosity, which will have a lasting impact on the lives of writers.

We are delighted to share that in the past year we have compensated writers a total of \$52,420 for their outstanding work. Contributor Gothataone Moeng, author of *Call and Response*, shared what publication in Ploughshares meant to her:

As an emergent writer from Botswana, reading literary journals such as Ploughshares keeps me connected to a greater literary community, by introducing me to a great number of upcoming and established writers and keeping me connected to literary trends and thematic preoccupations by writers publishing in the US. Throughout my many years of attempting to become a writer, Ploughshares has been a lodestar, a journal whose high standards and literary quality I could aspire to. It gave me immense pleasure to have my short story 'When Mrs. Kennekae Dreamt of Snakes' accepted for publication in the Summer 2022 issue. Having work published in such a prestigious and important journal has been pivotal to my career, as it has given me the respect and seriousness with which I wish my work could be taken.




### A Message from Editor-in-chief Ladette Randolph (continued)

Your generous support for Ploughshares has ensured that we will keep our promise to pay writers for their work. Acknowledging the worth of our writers in this way enables us to attract and publish the best new literature possible. Knowing we can continue to pay our writers gives us enormous confidence even as the publishing industry faces continued paper shortages and rising production costs. Despite the financial challenges of these additional costs, we are heartened by indicators of growth: The 2023 Emerging Writer's Contest was one of our most successful, second only to the 2020 contest, and our social media presence has grown to 110,000. We saw a 34% jump in digital subscription revenue, which allows us to satisfy the preferences of our readers and to remain flexibility in our ability to reach our international subscribers.

As we reflect on year 2023, we would be remiss if we also didn't acknowledge the valuable contributions of our longtime managing editor and blog editor, Ellen Duffer. As many of you know, in March of this past year, after almost a decade of service to Ploughshares, Ellen accepted an exciting new job. While we miss her, we're thrilled that Olivia Carey has stepped into the role, joining me, Allison Truj, Ning Ma, and the dedicated Emerson College students who help us carry on the valuable work of Ploughshares. We remain committed to the pursuit of literary excellence, and, as we hope the issues in this past volume year make explicit, we continue to provide a home for diverse voices and a platform for the transformative power of words. Because of your generous support, we continue to nurture the literary community and create an enduring impact on writers and readers alike. Thank you for being an integral part of our journey.






